

Attorneys General Who Joined Industry Groups In Filing A Lawsuit Against The CFPB Have Received At Least \$1.92 Million From Those Industry Groups And Their Members.

Summary: In September 2022, the U.S. Chamber of Commerce—self-described as the "[world's largest business association](#)"—along with several banking trade organizations including the American Bankers Association and the Consumer Bankers Association, [filed a lawsuit](#) in the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Texas against the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB).

The suit alleges that the CFPB's update to the Unfair, Deceptive, or Abusive Acts or Practices (UDAAP) section of its examination manual, particularly as it relates to "disparate impact," is an overreach by the agency and in violation of the Administrative Procedures Act. In December 2022, fourteen state attorneys general [filed an amicus brief](#) supporting industry's argument against the CFPB.

An Accountable.US review of data collected by [Follow The Money](#), has found that twelve of the fourteen state attorneys general on this amicus brief have taken at least **\$1.93 million in campaign contributions** from companies belonging to the U.S. Chamber of Commerce, the American Bankers Association, and the Consumer Bankers Association.

This raises concerns the attorneys general in the amicus brief are no more than mouthpieces for industry, disseminating the same talking points by trade groups that seek to upend the autonomy of the CFPB and hurt consumers in the process.

- **Attorney General Chris Carr (R-GA)**—who “led” the effort in filing the amicus brief in support of the lawsuit—**has taken at least \$290,316** from the lawsuit plaintiffs and their members.
- **Attorney General Steve Marshall (R-AL)** joined the amicus brief while **taking at least \$231,250** from the industry groups leading the lawsuit and their members.
- **Attorney General Mark Brnovich (R-AZ)** joined in filling the amicus brief supporting the industry groups' lawsuit while **receiving at least \$24,450** from the groups and their members.
- **Attorney General Leslie Rutledge (R-AR)**, who joined in filing the amicus brief, has also **taken at least \$18,052** from the industry groups in the lawsuit and their members.
- **Attorney General Lawrence Wasden (R-ID)** joined in filling the amicus brief supporting the industry group's lawsuit while **taking at least \$112,612** from those groups and their members.
- **Attorney General Todd Rokita (R-IN)** joined in filing the amicus brief supporting the industry groups' lawsuit while **taking at least \$311,204** from industry groups and their

members.

- **Attorney General Jeff Landry (R-LA)**, signed onto the amicus brief supporting industry, has also **taken at least \$124,000** from groups and its members attacking the CFPB.
- **Attorney General Lynn Fitch (R-MS)**, who joined the amicus brief, has **taken at least \$37,000** from trade organizations involved in the lawsuit and their members.
- **Attorney General Alan Wilson (R-SC)**, who signed onto the amicus brief, has also **taken at least \$147,898** in contributions from industry groups and their members.
- **Attorney General Ken Paxton (R-TX)**, who joined in the filing of the amicus brief, has **taken at least \$356,972** from industry groups involved in the lawsuit and their member companies.
- **Attorney General Sean D. Reyes (R-UT)**, who joined the amicus brief in support of industry, has **taken at least \$170,565** from trade groups in the lawsuit and their members.
- **Attorney General Patrick Morrissey (R-WV)**, who joined the amicus brief supporting industry trade groups, has **taken at least \$109,900** from these groups and their member companies.

After Seven Industry Groups Filed A Lawsuit Against The Consumer Financial Protection Bureau, 14 Attorneys General Joined Industry To Oppose The CFPB By Filing An Amicus Brief In Support Of The Filing.

In September 2022, Seven Industry Trade Groups Filed A Lawsuit Against The Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB), Arguing The CFPB's Recent Update To Its Examination Of Unfair, Deceptive, Or Abusive Acts Or Practices (UDAPP) "Exceeds Its Statutory Authority And Violates The Administrative Procedure Act (APA)."

The Litigation Charged That The CFPB Is "Exceeding Its Statutory Authority," Violated The APA's Procedural Requirements, And Called Into Question The Bureau's Funding Structure. "[T]he Bureau is exceeding its statutory authority outlined in the Dodd-Frank Act, the updated manual is 'arbitrary' and 'capricious,' and it violates the APA's procedural requirements because it constitutes a legislative rule that failed to go through notice and comment. The Lawsuit "Takes Aim" At The CFPB's Inclusion Of "Disparate Impact," Which Enables Regulators To Prosecute Practices That Adversely Affect One Group Of People Over Others, With The Plaintiffs Arguing The Practice Could Be Broadly Applied To Financial Products. "The lawsuit takes aim at the CFPB's inclusion of 'disparate impact,' a legal theory that allows regulators to prosecute practices that adversely affect one group of people over others, though the rules may appear neutral. Certain financial products, like no-fee checking accounts, could be seen as discriminatory using a disparate impact analysis, the Chamber said. Those accounts are typically offered to people with higher bank balances who are often further along in their careers, possibly pointing to discrimination against younger people."
