

A Who's Who Of Corporate-Backed Congressional Republicans That Voted To Back Trump's Big Brutal Betrayal

SUMMARY: In Q2 2025, congressional Republicans passed President Trump's Big Brutal Betrayal reconciliation package, which will <u>kick</u> 15 million Americans off of their insurance, <u>raise</u> energy bills across the country, and <u>eliminate</u> school meal access for more than 18 million kids while issuing massive tax breaks to billionaires and large corporations.

Now, <u>Accountable.US</u> research reveals that in Q2 2025, key Congressional Republicans took at least \$2.16 million from corporate interests that stand to benefit from tax breaks and other provisions in the reconciliation package, and at least \$220,000 from aligned conservative PACs that appear to have been pushing these recipients to vote for the package. This includes at least \$439,500 from Financial Services interests, \$415,000 from Healthcare & Pharmaceutical interests, \$141,000 from Telecommunications & Big Tech interests, \$124,500 from Oil & Gas interests, \$48,000 from Energy & Utility interests:

- Senate Majority Leader John Thune (R-SD)—\$228,000: Took At Least \$31,000 From Large
 Telecommunications And Internet Companies, Including A Combined \$15,000 From Verizon, Which
 Was One Of The Biggest Beneficiaries Of The 2017 Trump Tax Cuts. Also Took \$76,000 From The
 Healthcare And Big Pharma Industry, Including \$5,000 From Pfizer, Which Won A Major Tax Write-Off
 And Was Exempted From More Drug Price Negotiations With Medicare.
- Sen. Lisa Murkowski (R-AK)—\$39,000: Received At Least \$8,500 From Big Oil And Gas Companies, Which Won Numerous Tax Giveaways, And \$19,000 From Large Energy And Utilities Companies.
- Sen. Jon Husted (R-OH)—\$240,500: Took \$242,500 From Industry, Including \$75,000 From Big Pharma And The Healthcare Industries, \$33,000 From Banks And Financial Services, And \$21,500 From Big Oil And Gas.
- **Sen. Ted Budd (R-NC)—\$7,000**: Received A \$1,000 Contribution From The National Venture Capital Association And \$7,000 From The Telecommunications And Internet Providers Industry.

 Tax Writeoffs And More Drilling Rights, Including In The Gulf Of Mexico Bordering Texas. Also Took
 \$38,500 From Major Telecommunications Providers And Media Networks, Including \$5,000 From
 Verizon, One Of The Biggest Beneficiaries Of The 2017 Tax Cuts.
- Sen. John Barrasso (R-WY)—\$35,500: Took \$13,000 From Big Oil And Gas Interests While Touting
 The Reconciliation Bill's Giveaways To Big OII.
- House Speaker Mike Johnson (R-LA)—\$212,000: Took \$37,500 From The Big Pharma And Healthcare Industry, Including \$5,000 From The Influential Pharmaceutical Research & Manufacturers Of America (PhRMA), Which Won A Tax Giveaway. Also Took At Least \$73,500 From Large Banks And The Financial Services Industry.
- House Majority Leader Steve Scalise (R-LA)—\$188,950: Took \$56,000 From Financial Industry
 Corporations And Groups, \$63,500 From The Healthcare Industry, And \$89,450 From Other Industry
 Groups, Including The U.S. Chamber Of Commerce.

- Majority Whip Tom Emmer (R-MN)—\$194,000: Took \$123,000 From Wall Street Banks And Financial Services And Insurance Companies And \$39,500 From Big Pharma And Health Insurance Industry Interests.
- Rep. Jeff Van Drew (R-NJ)—\$21,000.00: Took \$3,500 From The National Apartment Association
 And National Association Of Realtors, An Industry That Received Numerous Tax Giveaways In The
 Reconciliation Bill.
- Rep. Rob Bresnahan (R-PA)—\$182,000: Took \$61,000 From Republican Members Of Congress And Conservative PACs And \$7,500 From Real Estate And Hotel Industry Groups Which Won Major Tax Giveaways In The Republicans' Reconciliation Package.

"Asked by The Independent Thursday about her keen hope that the House of Representatives would fix what troubled her about the bill she voted to pass — which extends the 2017 tax cuts that Trump signed while also significantly slashing welfare programs like Medicaid and forcing states to shoulder more of the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), formerly known as food stamps — Murkowski bristled. 'Yeah, and they didn't do it,' she said of the House's unchanged passage of the bill in time for Trump to sign it into law on July 4. She didn't elaborate on what that new crisis might be. 'That's it, she snapped. 'You got one.' And then she walked away from the gaggle. [...] She insisted she wasn't pleased with the final bill, despite voting yes and creating a 50-50 tie that Vice President J.D. Big Oil And Gas Companies Won Numerous "New Lease Sales On Public Land And In Federal Waters In Alaska And The Gulf Of Mexico," Lower Royalty Rates, And Even Won "Subsidies For Projects To Capture Carbon And Use It To Recover More Oil." "Fossil-fuel companies Oil-and-gas lobbyists have called the legislation a home run. It mandates new lease sales on public land and in federal waters in Alaska and the Gulf of Mexico, as well as in Western states. Lower royalty rates are reinstated, and the bill augments subsidies for projects that capture carbon and use it to recover more oil. On July 03, 2025, Husted Defended Imposing New Work Requirements For Medicaid Recipients Claiming They Won't Be "Impacting Anyone Who Relies" On Medicaid. "Otherwise, Husted said the Big Beautiful Bill helps shore up Medicaid by imposing work requirements for people between the ages of 18 and 64 who are covered through Medicaid expansion, a pool of working, poor people, and by reducing coverage of non-citizens. Although "Ciscomani Downplayed Concerns About The Medicaid Cuts, The House Did Not Make Any Changes To The Finalized Version After Ciscomani Was 1 Of 16 Republicans Who Sent A Letter To Senate Majority Leader Thune Warning Against Deep Cuts To Medicaid:

Ciscomani downplayed concerns about the Medicaid cuts, asserting the changes will strengthen the program's fiscal viability "and protect it for the people that need it the most."

The 218-212 vote by bleary-eyed lawmakers came after a grueling all-night debate.

Just last week, Ciscomani was one of 16 Republicans who penned a letter to Senate Majority Leader John Thune and House Speaker Mike Johnson, warning that the Senate version — the one the House finalized without changes — slashed Medicaid too deeply.

Moreover, wealthy filers claimed substantially larger average deductions—\$1,024,246 for those with AGI of \$10 million or more. By contrast, filers with AGI below \$100,000 with the deduction—who accounted for 51 percent of claimants—claimed, on average, \$1,997. (see Figure 1)

He says the only people who will lose coverage are illegal immigrants and able-bodied people who refuse to comply with new work rules calling for 20 hours of work or volunteering to keep their coverage."
